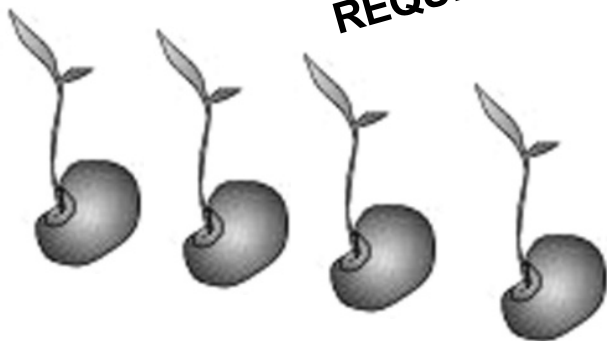

Yet, there is a story of who we are and of our history that is available to us. It is at our fingertips, so to speak. It is the Bible. The Bible tells the story of God's people, of creation, of salvation. It tells of God's love and how we

If not, I encourage you to make the time to share your stories of faith with your family. It will be the greatest investment in telling them who they are and whose they are that you could ever make.

Emmanuel Council Meeting Minutes – May 15, 2011

It was noted by the Council Secretary that there was not a quorum in attendance.

Devotions were led by Pastor Little and were taken from the Treasury of Daily Prayer with a prayer from Thomas Aquinas.

Approval of Agenda – moved by John, seconded by Nathan.

Treasurer & Financial Secretary Reports – Discussed the Treasurer's Report for Women of the ELCA, Schneider Cemetery, and also discussed new signature cards for the Youth accounts at Wilson State Bank. Motion was made by Nathan, and seconded by John.

Secretary's Report – The April report was reviewed. Moved by Pastor and seconded by John.

Member Reports/Requests –

- A. Rhonda Templing reported that she has completed the requirements to be certified as a Parish Ministry Associate. She will be installed on May 29th during the morning worship service. Her mission is to serve between clergy and the congregation working to set up and organize events within the church.
- B. Terri Rous made a request to open the Fellowship Hall for Biking Across Kansas, so they might use our facilities to freshen up, and possibly serve cookies and water. A motion

was made to allow Biking Across Kansas to use the Fellowship Hall from 12 Noon until 4 PM. The motion was made by Pastor, seconded by Nathan.

- C. Also to allow Terri to purchase 20 cases of water for Biking Across Kansas or possibly ice cream. The motion was made by John, and seconded by Nathan.

Old Business

- A. Weight Watchers – Terri will provide a copy of the contract for the June Council meeting.
- B. Council Vacancy – no one has volunteered for the council vacancy, please drop from the announcement list.
- C. Audit Committee – Julie is to compose a letter asking whether the following would like to serve on that committee: Jim Griffitt, Jozet Littrell, Bill Boxberger, Amy Boxberger or Kathy Jonas.
- D. Bathroom Stall Doors – The stalls in the Fellowship Hall bathrooms require new hinges at possibly a cost of \$100.
- E. Mutual Ministry – No action.
- F. Seeds of Faith
 1. Supply Ministers – all scheduled vacancies are paid by Seeds of Faith, otherwise that particular minister is responsible.
 2. Announcement page or newsletter – notify what minister will be in attendance on what particular Sunday.
- G. ELCA Youth Convocation 2012 – The motion of \$500 from the Youth Fund and \$500 from the General Fund to help with the costs. John moved, with a second by Pastor.

New Business

- A. Fellowship Hall –
 1. Currently the fee for use of the Church Fellowship Hall is \$50. The Women of the ELCA are proposing that fee be changed to \$40, with those funds going to the Treasurer to offset expenses incurred in the use of the Fellowship Hall. Further the e-mail states that Rhonda Templing and Sharon Custer, who

are both PMA's in the church, would handle the scheduling of the Fellowship Hall. The fee should be paid at the time of scheduling.

2. A proposal to have the Fellowship Hall carpet cleaned. Motion was made by John, with a second by Nathan.
 - B. Committee Reports –
 1. Christian Education – Meetings are scheduled for Christian Ed & VBS. Melissa has said she will take leadership of VBS. The survey that was sent out, had 12 responses and 9 of those would be willing to teach. John moved, with a second by Julie.
 2. Property –

 - § Stone repair – two quotes listed with one from Devine Masonry for \$750, and Herrman Masonry for \$200. The motion was made to accept the bid from Herrman. Motion made by Nathan, seconded by John.
 - § Windows glazed – Randy Beran did work which included 4 new glasses.
 - § Window replacement – bid submitted by Southard Corp. to replace 8 windows—there are several options to choose from.
 3. Evangelism.

 5. Stewardship.
 6. Worship & Music – John stated that he could help with closing hymns.
 - C. Evaluation questionnaire passed out – Council should answer and present at June 12th meeting.
 - D. Snow Cone Machine – A motion was made to allow the snow cone machine to be used by the High School Youth on June 6th with the understanding that it should be returned in like and better condition. Motion made by John, with Nathan as second.
 - E. Counting & Depositing – Member of council, plus financial secretary to be responsible for counting and depositing offering. Member of council to be used a month at a time, with John taking the June slot.

MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING 6/8/2011

Meeting was called to order by President Austin Nokes at 7:30 P.M.

Secretary minutes were read and approved with a few minor corrections on spelling.

Don Hanhardt gave treasurer's report. Total income for month was \$9,612.75 less expenses of \$7,740.84 leaving profit of \$1,871.91. Year to date income was \$48,070.77 less expenses of \$42,968.48 leaving a positive profit of \$5,102.29. Reported the Lenten Collections were paid out divided between the 3 food banks we support in the amount of \$314.17 each.

Dennis Smith gave his financial secretary report stating there were 54 average attendance in May 2011 with 51 giving units. Giving has been very supportive this year.

Pastor Patricia Reep gave her report stating that this has been a very busy time of year also synod assembly was in K.C. Mo held from 6/3/11 to 6/5/11.
